

Part Exams in Year 6

1 There will be two series of written tests:

- one during two weeks in December/January and
- one during two weeks in June.

Each series will consist of a test in each subject for which a written Baccalaureate examination may be organised, ie:

Language I	4 periods (3h 20 min)	} The tests consist of two parts: one with, one without a calculator
Language II	3 periods (2h 30 min)	
Maths 5	4 periods (3h 20 min)	}
Maths 3	3 periods (2h 30 min)	
Art	4 periods (3h 20 min)	
All other 4-period options	3 periods (2h 30 min)	
Adv Lang I	4 periods (3h 20 min)	
Adv Lang II	4 periods (3h 20 min)	

There may be two tests organised for each pupil per day.

2 **Philosophy 2 and Advanced Maths:** a short written examination will be organised as part of the normal school week at the end of each semester. The time allowed will be two consecutive teaching periods. The final B mark will be the arithmetical average of the two semester B marks.

Biology 2, History 2 and Geography 2: two short written examinations lasting one teaching period will be organised as part of the normal timetable in the course of each semester. The final B mark will be the arithmetical average of the four semester B marks

Complementary courses: a single short written examination lasting one teaching period will be organised at the end of each semester. The final B mark will be the arithmetical average of the two semester B marks.

PE: The B mark shows the results of the test held at the end of each unit of instruction. These tests are purely practical, involving no written work of any kind.

3 The results of all tests will be taken into account as the B marks for promotion into Year 7. The B1 mark is the mark obtained only by the first semester test; the B2 mark is the mark obtained only by the second semester test. The final B mark will be the arithmetical average of the two semester B marks. No other tests can be given to obtain a B mark.
